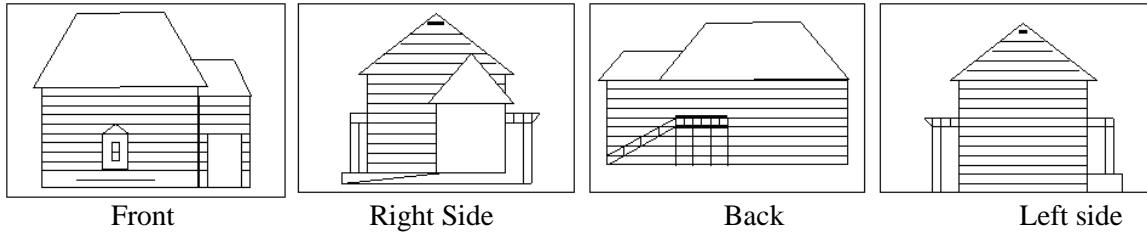

The following information is **REQUIRED** in order for you to receive any applicable coverage under the warranty:

- A. Copy of Proof of Purchase (i.e. contract, invoice)
- B. Clear, color photographs as listed below. Unfortunately, due to inconsistent quality, Polaroid photos are not acceptable. See the attached Photograph Instruction Sheet for guidelines.
 - Full view photo of entire structure.
 - Full view photos from each corner of the structure properly marked with applicable direction. (i.e. Front, Right Side, Back, Left Side).
 - Close up photos that illustrate your concerns properly marked Front, Right Side, Back, Left Side.
- C. All claims will require a sample piece of the affected area of vinyl siding in order to accurately evaluate the claim. If the claim is against "two (2)" or more colors or there is a variance between panels, we need a sample of each color or variance to process the claim.
 - Sample piece must be no less than 6 inches and no greater than 6 foot in length (**Samples may require alternate packaging**)
 - Samples should always be identified by adding homeowner name to the back of the panel prior to submitting for testing.
 - Sample must come from affected area and best demonstrate your area of concern.
 - Samples should not be cut when removed from home.
 - Samples will be returned to the homeowner after evaluation.
- D. If This is a Hail Damage Claim a copy of the Insurance Company Adjustment / Settlement Report Homeowner
- E. This Warranty Claim Form

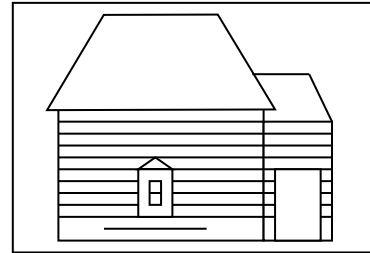

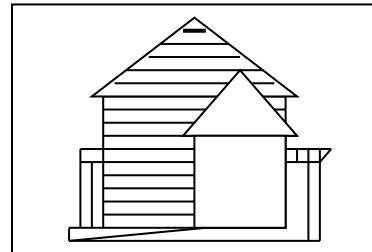
Photograph Instructions

In order to evaluate your claim, a minimum of (10) photographs of the vinyl siding and installation are required. Take photographs of each entire side of the structure (as shown below), as well as, close ups of the affected vinyl siding and accessories/trim. Please feel free to include as many additional photographs as you wish to illustrate the condition.

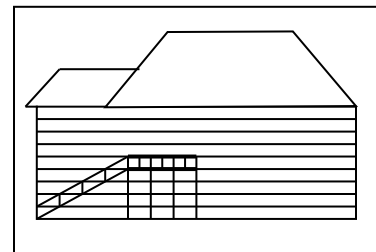
- Use a 35-mm camera. Disposable cameras may be used, but must be developed prior to submitting.
- Digital cameras may be used but must be emailed or sent in .jpeg format on CD-R or CD-RW discs. If printed, quality photographic paper a minimum of 3x5 in size may be used.
- Be sure to take pictures of all sides of your home.
- Be sure to take pictures that will show problem areas that will fill the entire field of view.
- Please label the reverse side of any printed photos with the direction of the view, and your name.
- Please indicate with small arrows or asterisk where you feel the areas of concern are located.



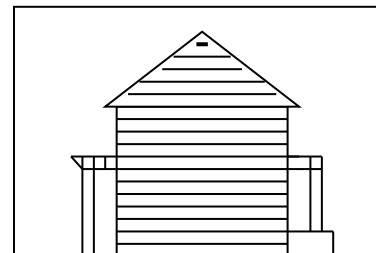

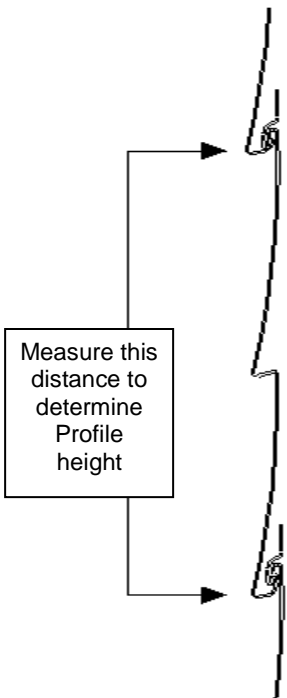

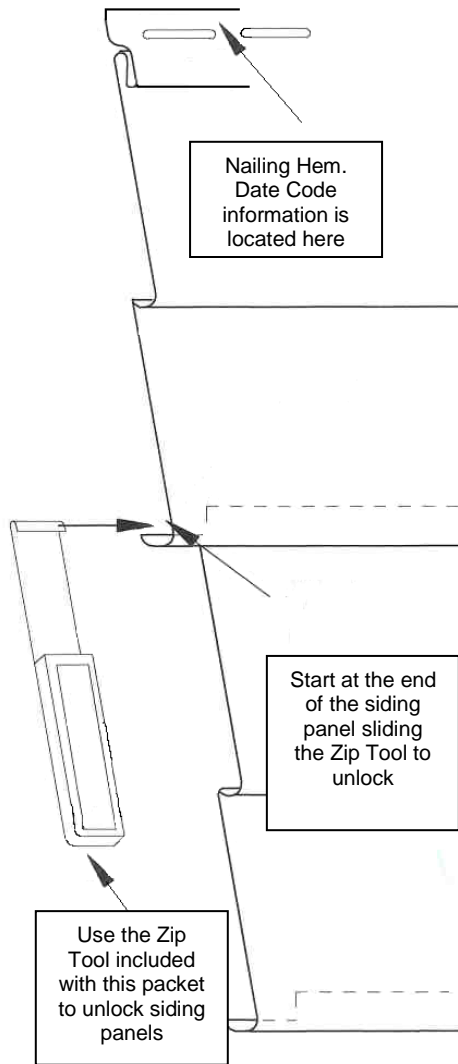

A Date Code is located on the Nailing Hem of all Georgia-Pacific Vinyl Siding panels. This Date Code provides information that will identify date and time of manufacture, as well as, the specific plant of manufacture. This information is required to process your claim.

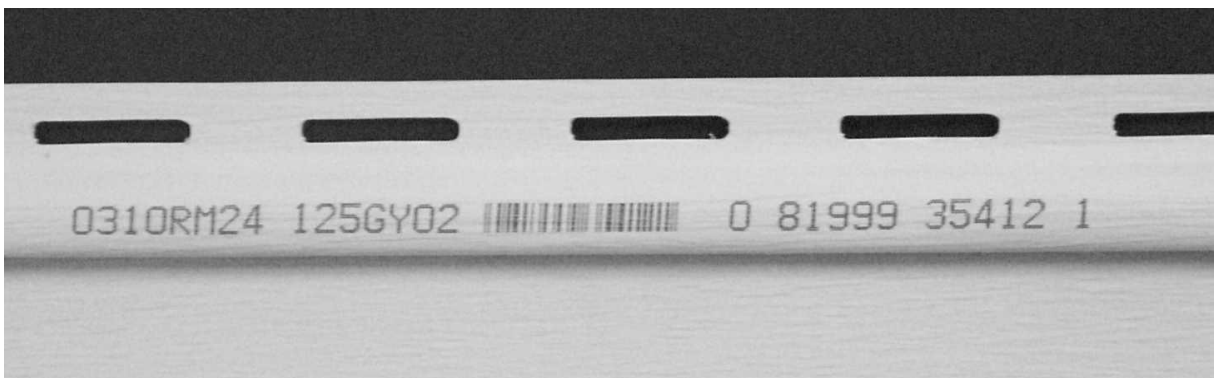
Getting Access to your Georgia-Pacific Vinyl Siding Date Code

Removing a Siding Panel

Starting at the end of a siding panel, hook the rolled edge of the Zip Tool onto the hook at the bottom of the siding panel as shown in diagram A. While applying pressure downward, slide the zip tool away from the end of the siding panel. This will "unzip" the siding panel from the lock of the panel below it and give you visibility of the Date Code. Only unzip the panel as far as needed to identify the Date Code. In some cases it may be necessary to unzip more than one panel to locate a Date Code. Always re-lock an unzipped siding panel before removing another.

Re-locking an Unzipped Siding Panel

After you have recorded your Date Code you should re-lock that panel back into place. To re-lock a siding panel, place the rolled edge of the Zip Tool into bottom lock of the unzipped panel. Pull downward while sliding the Zip Tool back toward the unlocked end of the siding panel. It may be necessary to apply pressure to the face of the siding panel while re-locking.



You will have one of two types of Date Codes on your Georgia-Pacific Siding depending on when your siding was manufactured. Products manufactured after 1994 will have an ink-jet printed Date Code on the roll of the lock. Product Manufactured before 1995 will have an embossed Date Code. After you have located the Date Code, please record the full code on the line provided in question # 13 of the Homeowner Warranty Claim Form.
